Glazing Tips From Richard

Richard, who led the glazing workshop, has a few words of advice:

- 1) Take extra care when waxing the bottom of your pieces. A messy wax job can really take away from the beauty of your final product, so take the time to wax carefully and cleanly.
- The high-fire dipping glazes should be mixed thoroughly before and during use. The glaze should be about the consistency of light cream. If the glaze you are using seems especially thick, ask the studio assistant on duty to check and dilute the glaze if needed.
- 3) Try keeping a glaze journal. Take notes on which glazes you used and how you used them (dipping, brushing, pouring, decorative techniques, etc.) This will help you avoid combinations that you weren't happy with and to repeat and refine successful glaze combos.
