## Open Studio Hours

All currently enrolled students are welcome to use the studio during our open studio hours. # Paper Clay Slip



We have begun to supply a special slip using both of the studio clay bodies. If you haven't tried the paper clay slip for joining pieces together, look for it on a shelf in the front room. Paper clay is exactly that --- clay slip with paper fibers whipped into it. At a level we cannot see, the paper fibers serve to create bonds between pieces of clay, linking

them more securely than plain slip or slip with vinegar. Think of it as "super glue". Because of the paper, you might notice a strong odor and some discoloration in the container which is a possible downside of working with paper clay. But many people think the advantages of paper clay are worth it.

Colored slips are used for decorative purposes and can be applied to greenware at the wet or leather hard stage. When used under translucent glazes, those colors show through with sometimes very dramatic results. There are numerous examples of slip decoration on display in La Mano's gallery. You can find 5 to 6 colored slips on a shelf in the front room.

## What is a "Studio Potter"?





Experienced artists who want greater access to our studio and do not currently need class instruction can apply for our studio potter program. Each studio potter is assigned a shelf of their own, for storage of their work in progress and tools. They can work in the studio whenever it is open and have full access to all our equipment.
