

The other side of Diane is that she was educated as an engineer, worked in the aerospace industry which she left to get her MBA. With that, she was successful in the not for profit sector. Potter's Tip of the Month

Often when pinching a pinch pot, the rim will become uneven or one side may be higher than the other. Use a sharp scissors to trim the edge (but keep the elbow of your working arm level while doing so!).
